1 there's been no intimation of any violation. I want to
2 thank the bonding company for making the appropriate
3 arrangements. Counsel.

4 MR. : I'm handing up orders of
5 protection at this point.

6 THE COURT: All right. So then based on the
7 people's application, the defendant's previous plea to
8 conspiracy in the second degree is vacated. Upon
9 application of the people that count is dismissed.
10 Defendant's prior plea to criminal solicitation in the
11 second degree stands. Defendant ready for sentencing?

12 MR. LEVINE: Yes, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: Mr. , anything further you
14 wish to say?

15 MR. : No, no, Your Honor.

16 THE COURT: Counsel, anything you wish to say?

17 MR. LEVINE: One moment, Your Honor.

18 THE DEFENDANT: No, I thank you, judge.

19 MR. LEVINE: I just wanted to see if she wanted
20 me to speak for her. Judge, I have nothing to say.

21 THE COURT: Miss , anything you wish to say?

22 THE DEFENDANT: I think I've said it all. Thank
23 you very much.

24 THE COURT: I would be remiss if I didn't
25 acknowledge on the record, you know, what I consider to be

1 the services performed by defense counsel here who --
2 you're not 18 B on this, are you?

3 MR. LEVINE: No, judge.

4 THE COURT: So if you were retained, I'm sure
5 that retainer is long since exhausted and I know that
6 you've had intermittent difficulties with your client.
7 Nevertheless, you know, in the best tradition of the bar,
8 you hung in there. You've made all these appearances.
9 You've been an admirable advocate on her behalf and the
10 entire system is grateful to you. And I would say to the
11 people, I think this is a reasonable resolution.

12 I appreciate -- I mean I don't want the Court's
13 concern for Miss physical condition to in any way
14 diminish not only the seriousness of the offense but the
15 legitimate concerns of the potential victims here. I
16 appreciate their concern. I think we've attempted to craft
17 a resolution that both meets those concerns and is
18 cognizant of the circumstance of the defendant.

19 So with all of that, on the charge of criminal
20 solicitation in the second degree, the defendant is
21 sentenced to a five year period of probation, a condition
22 of that probation being continued confinement to her house,
23 subject to electronic monitoring, with her being allowed to
24 attend to health related visits and religious services.
